



Joe Coyne | Principal Consultant, CBI

Born and raised in Platte County, he built his career on hard work and service—starting as a diesel mechanic and earning a degree in Power Plant Technology before becoming a certified Journeyman Mechanic at Laramie River Station. He later earned a degree in Biblical Theology and currently serves as the senior pastor at Impact Ministries. Additionally, Jeremy has represented House District 4 in the Wyoming House of Representatives since 2021 and the House Speaker Pro Tempore since January 2025. He has also held key community leadership positions, including president of the Platte County Ministerial Society and chairman of the Platte County Chamber of Commerce.



Allen Thompson | Executive Director, Wyoming Association of Sheriffs and Chiefs of Police

Allen Thompson brings 25+ years of experience in law enforcement and public service to his role of WASCOP Executive Director. Thompson began his law enforcement career in 1998 with the Sheridan Police Department, where he served in uniform patrol, trained new officers, and rose to the rank of patrol sergeant. In 2006, he joined the Sheridan County Sheriff's Office and was promoted to undersheriff in 2017. That same year, he was appointed Sheriff, a position he held with distinction until his retirement in 2022. Thompson now leads WASCOP in advocating for contemporary law enforcement needs across the state. In his role, he supports agencies in navigating legislative changes, securing critical funding through pass-through grants, and enhancing training and equipment standards—particularly for agencies facing manpower or resource challenges. His goal is to ensure every agency—large or small—has the tools, voice, and support needed to serve and protect their communities effectively.



Matt Murdock | Mayor, Pinedale, Wyoming

Matt Murdock is a lifelong resident of Sublette County with deep roots in the Pinedale community. After earning his degree, he spent 19 years in West Africa working on rural development projects with tribal communities and international organizations, focusing on sustainable community development and cross-cultural collaboration. Upon returning to Pinedale in 2011, Murdock reengaged with the community through work in local schools, the nonprofit and faith-based sectors, and as an entrepreneur. He was appointed to the Pinedale Town Council in 2013, and was first elected mayor in 2018.. During his time in office, Murdock has earned multiple Emergency Management Institute Certificates, chaired Pinedale's Travel and Tourism Commission, championed broadband expansion, supported local healthcare infrastructure, and led regional policy and legislative efforts to strengthen Pinedale's resilience and economic vitality.



Tim Stubson | General Counsel, WAM

Tim Stubson is a Partner at Crowley Fleck PLLP in Casper, Wyoming, and a member of the firm's Commercial and Natural Resources Litigation Practice Group. His practice centers on complex commercial litigation in sectors such as oil and gas, healthcare, construction, banking, and real estate. He is a seasoned trial lawyer with significant appellate experience, regularly appearing before the Wyoming Supreme Court. A Wyoming native, Tim received his J.D. from the University of Wyoming School of Law and began his legal career clerking for U.S. District Judge William F. Downes. He served in the Wyoming House of Representatives from January 2008 until 2017. He continues to support the legal system through his service on the Permanent Rules Advisory Committee of the Wyoming Judicial Branch, helping shape rules for the Wyoming Supreme Court and Chancery Court.

She previously led Goshen County Economic Development Corporation, overseeing county-wide initiatives including the Chamber of Commerce, tourism, and Main Street programs. Ashley holds a B.S. in Communications, with an emphasis in Public Relations, from the University of Wyoming and is a 2024 graduate of Leadership Wyoming.

A longtime Cheyenne resident, Landon graduated from Cheyenne East High School and earned a Master's in Public Administration from the University of Wyoming. He currently directs Annual Grants and Giving at Cheyenne Regional Medical Center Foundation. Landon has also contributed to the community as a City Planning Commissioner, animal rescue board treasurer, and local science fair judge. He is committed to representing his constituents on education, military, and transportation issues.

Lee Filer is a dedicated public servant currently representing Wyoming's District 44. A lifelong resident of Cheyenne, Lee is deeply connected to his community and understands its needs firsthand. He is a small business owner and entrepreneur who values service, demonstrated by his time in the Wyoming Air National Guard and active involvement on local boards and commissions. J.D. Williams | Representative, House District 2

J.D. Williams is a Republican representing Wyoming House District 2. Williams previously served in the same seat from October 22, 2021, to January 10, 2023. A lifelong rancher and proud Wyomingite, Williams was raised in Saratoga, Wyoming. He holds a bachelor's degree in Agricultural Economics and a degree in Ranch Management from the University of Wyoming. Since 2000, he has managed the Four Three Ranch in northern Niobrara County, working the land and tending cattle—seeing grass as his crop and cows as his tools for stewardship. Williams is currently serving on the Education Committee and served on the House Travel, Recreation, Wildlife & Cultural Resources Committee, where he brought firsthand knowledge of the challenges and opportunities facing Wyoming's landowners, sportsmen, and conservationists. His deep roots in the region trace back to the 1880s, when his ancestors emigrated from Sweden and settled in eastern Laramie County. The Malm family farmed the land for nearly a century before expanding into banking, business, and real estate in the 1980s. Gunnar currently serves as Chairman of the Laramie County Commission and Treasurer for the Wyoming County Commissioners Association. 


